- 2. The above-mentioned grant is subject to the under mentioned conditions:-
- [i] As approved by PAB recurring grant including salary for SPSU have been provided for full financial year 2013-14, except the salary of staff yet to be appointed, which were approved from 1st September, 2013. The salary of the Programme Manager, Administrative Officer and Account Officer have been provided as per the State Government rate which is higher than the ICPS norms as these posts are filled up on deputation basis. Non-recurring grant has already been provided to the State.
- [ii] As approved by PAB recurring grant including salary have been provided for SCPS from the date of appointment of staff, i.e. for seven months from 1st September, 2013 as per ICPS norms. Non-recurring grant has already been provided to the State. PAB has also approved in principle proposal for innovative project in the State. However, grant-in-aid would be considered after the State submits detailed proposal.
- [iii] As approved by PAB recurring grants for all 14 DCPUs, including salary, grants for sponsorship and aftercare, have been provided from the date of appointment of staff i.e. for seven months from 1st September, 2013. Non-recurring grant has already been provided to the State.
- [iv] As approved by PAB all recurring grant including salary have been provided for SARA from the date of appointment of staff, i.e. for Nine months and Twelve days from 19th June, 2013. Non-recurring grant has already been provided to the State.

- [v] As approved by PAB, recurring grants for 8 NGO run SAAs already being supported under ICPS, has been provided as per ICPS norms for the year 2013-14. Non-recurring grants have been provided for 2 SAAs which have not been provided previously. (List attached)
- [vi] As approved by PAB, grants have been provided on the basis of actual number of beneficiaries for only those Government run 24 Homes (8 CH, 2 SH, 11 OH and 3 Homes for Special Need Children) which have beneficiaries present in them for full financial year. No grant has been provided for After Care Homes as the grant for After Care Component is being provided under DCPU. As decided by PAB, non-recurring and up-gradation of existing Government run Homes would be considered after rationalization exercise is completed and on receipt of a fresh proposal from the State. For Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) run Homes, PAB has accorded in-principle approval, hence, recurring and non-recurring grants would be considered after the State provides the requisite details. (List attached)
- [vii] As approved by PAB, recurring grant for whole financial year have been provided for 2 existing Open Shelters and recurring grant for 1 additional Open Shelter [Association for Welfare of the Handicapped (Free Birds), Kozhikode] has been provided for 8 months from 1st August, 2013. Non-recurring grant for the aforesaid additional Open Shelter has also been provided. (List attached)
- [viii] There are **14 existing** Child Welfare Committees (CWCs). As approved by PAB, recurring grant for all 14 CWCs for the whole financial year based on the actual number of sittings, except, the salary of Data Entry Operator has been provided. As the State Government has not yet provided the date(s) of appointment of Data Entry Operator in CWCs, the salary of the Data Entry Operator has not been provided. The salary of the Data Entry Operator would be considered after receipt of the date(s) of appointment from State as reimbursement.
- [ix] There are 14 existing Juvenile Justice Boards (JJBs). As approved by PAB, recurring grant for all 14 JJBs for the whole financial year based on the actual number of sittings, except, the salary of Data Entry Operator has been provided. As the State Government has not yet provided the date(s) of appointment of Data Entry Operator in JJBs, the salary of the Data Entry Operator has not been provided. The salary of the Data Entry Operator would be considered after receipt of the date(s) of appointment from State as reimbursement.
- [x] The Government of Kerala shall reflect the amount in the audited statement of accounts together with the necessary Statement of Expenditure in respect of the above grants and submit the same to this Ministry immediately after the close of the current financial year 2013-14.
- [xi] It is certified that Rule 209(6) (iii) of GFR, have kept in view at the time of releasing Grant to the State Govt'.
- [xii] The accounts of all grantee Institutions or Organisations shall be open to inspection by the sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG(DPC) Act 1971 and internal audit by the Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry or Department, whenever the Institution or Organisation is called upon to do so.

- 2. The above-mentioned grant is subject to the under mentioned conditions:-
- [i] The release of 1st instalment of recurring grant for the financial year 2013-14, for all existing components/projects under ICPS, to all State Governments who have received grants under ICPS in 2012-13 and four States (Himachal Pradesh, Kerala & Punjab) that received grants in 2011-12 is as per the directions of Secretary (WCD). This release is on ad hoc basis for the financial year 2013-14.
- [ii] The grant being released as 1st Instalment during 2013-14, is 50% of the central share of recurring grant for each component under ICPS as mentioned in the sanction letter issued during 2012-13/2011-12 to each State Governments as listed at Para1(Table) above. Further, the funds being released need to be utilized component-wise only as per the central share mentioned in the sanction letter issued. For E.g.:- The 50% of recurring grant being released for SPSU should only be utilized for SPSU component and not for any other component.
- [iii] The 2nd and final Instalment will be approved subject to the consideration of financial proposal by the PAB, submission of statement of expenditure by the State for Financial year 2012-13 and the grant being released now as first instalment for 2013-14, and approval thereon. Also, any new project/component will be considered in the PAB at the time of release of 2nd instalment of the current year. The State Governments will maintain separate records of expenditure incurred for implementation of ICPS and furnish Statement of Expenditure for financial year 2012-13 and the 1st Instalment of 2013-14 along with the Implementation Report.
- [iv] The State Governments/UT Administrations shall reflect the amount in the audited statement of accounts together with the necessary utilization certificates in respect of the above grants and submit the same to this Ministry immediately after the close of the current financial year 2013-14.
- [v] It is certified that Rule 209(6)(iii) of GFR, have kept in view at the time of releasing Grant to the State Govt.
- [vi] The accounts of all grantee Institutions or Organisations shall be open to inspection by the sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG(DPC) Act 1971 and internal audit by the Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry or Department, whenever the Institution or Organisation is called upon to do so.
- [vii] It is certified that 'Rule 212(5) is not applicable to this grant.
