- [i] As approved by PAB, the recurring grant for State Project Support Unit (SPSU) has been provided for full financial year 2013-14, except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms. Non-recurring grant for setting up of SPSU has already been provided to the State Government.
- [ii] As approved by PAB, the recurring grant for State Child Protection Society (SCPS) has been provided for full financial year 2013-14, except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms.

PAB accorded in-principle approval for grant-in-aid for supporting Innovative project in the State under SCPS, to be released after the State submits detailed proposal. The State has submitted detailed proposal regarding innovative project to be undertaken by them, hence grant-in-aid for supporting Innovative project has been included.

PAB approved recurring grant for all 19 DCPUs for full financial year 2013-14 except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment and rent component for only 4 DCPUs for 12 months as requested by State, as per ICPS norms. Sponsorship and Aftercare Grant was approved for all districts for full financial year as requested by the State. The eligible grants for DCPUs has been calculated as per the requirement projected by the State and ICPS norms whichever is less.

- [v] As approved by PAB, recurring grants has been provided for full financial year 2013-14 for the 16 existing SAAs as per ICPS norms.

PAB also approved recurring and non-recurring grant for 10 additional SAAs from the date of sanction, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. The State has submitted a revised proposal, however, non-recurring grant has been requested for only 9 additional SAAs. Grant has been provided as per the requirement projected by the State and ICPS norms, whichever is less. (List attached)

[vi] PAB approved recurring grant for 21 existing open shelters for full financial year 2013-14.

PAB also approved the recurring and non-recurring grants for additional 9 open shelters from the date of sanction, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. The State has submitted a revised proposal requesting grant for 30 Open Shelters. Grant has been provided as per the requirement projected by the State and ICPS norms, whichever is less. PAB approved recurring grant for exiting 18 Govt. run Homes, grant for which was released during 2012-13, as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. The State has submitted a revised proposal requesting grant for 19 Government run Homes as per the actual number of beneficiaries, , however as the approval was accorded for 18 Government run Homes, grant has been calculated for the same. (List attached)

PAB also approved non-recurring grant for 5 Homes and up-gradation (non-recurring) grant for only 3 Homes. In-principle approval was accorded for up-gradation (non-recurring) grant for the other 2 Homes to be provided when the State submits PWD estimates. (List attached)

PAB also approved recurring grant was for 4 Specialised Unit in Children's Home for Special Needs Children which were supported last year for full financial year as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. The State has now submitted a revised proposal requesting grant for 8 Specialised Unit in Children's Home for Special Needs Children, however as the approval was accorded for 4 Specialised Unit in Children's Home for Special Needs Children, grant has been calculated for the same. PAB approved up-gradation (non-recurring) grant for 1 Home (Pravartak Seva Niketan, Hoogly) as the State has submitted PWD estimates. (List attached)

PAB approved grant for 13 existing Specialised Unit in Children's Home for Special Needs Children which were supported last year for full financial year as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. The State has submitted a revised proposal requesting grant for 13 exiting and 4 additional Specialised Unit in Children's Home for Special Needs Children as per the actual number of beneficiaries. Grant has been calculated as per the requirement projected by the State and ICPS norms, whichever is less. (List attached)

- [viii] There are 19 existing Child Welfare Committees (CWCs). PAB has approved, recurring grant for all 19 CWCs for the complete financial year based on the actual number of sittings and the number of members appointed, except the salary of Data Entry Operator, which was approved from the date of appointment provided by the State, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. The State has submitted a revised proposal requesting grant for 19 CWCs as per 3 meetings per weeks. Grant has been calculated as per the requirement projected by the State and ICPS norms, whichever is less. The meeting allowance/honorarium of the Chairperson and members of the CWCs has been calculated on the basis of number of sittings indicated against them.
- There are 19 existing Juvenile Justice Boards (JJBs). PAB has approved, recurring grant for all 19 JJBs for the complete financial year based on the actual number of sittings and the number of members appointed, except the salary of Data Entry Operator, which was approved from the date of appointment provided by the State, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. The State has submitted a revised proposal requesting grant for 19 JJBs as per 5 meetings per weeks. Grant has been calculated as per the requirement projected by the State and ICPS norms, whichever is less. The meeting allowance/honorarium of the members of the JJBs has been calculated on the basis of number of sittings indicated against them.
