


- [ii] The grant being released as 1st Instalment during 2014-15, is 25% of the central share of recurring grant for each component under ICPS as mentioned in the sanction letter issued during 2013-14 to each State Governments as listed at Para1(Table) above. Further, the funds being released need to be utilized component-wise only as per the central share mentioned in the sanction letter issued. For E.g.:- The 25% of recurring grant being released for SPSU should only be utilized for SPSU component and not for any other component.
- [iii] The 2nd and final Instalment will be approved subject to the consideration of financial proposal by the PAB, submission of statement of expenditure by the State for Financial year 2013-14 and the grant being released now as first instalment for 2014-15, and approval thereon. Also, any new project/component will be considered in the PAB at the time of release of 2nd instalment of the current year. The State Governments will maintain separate records of expenditure incurred for implementation of ICPS and furnish Statement of Expenditure for financial year 2013-14 and the 1st Instalment of 2014-15 along with the Implementation Report.
- [iv] The State Governments/UT Administrations shall reflect the amount in the audited statement of accounts together with the necessary Statement of Expenditure in respect of the above grants and submit the same to this Ministry immediately after the close of the current financial year 2014-15.
- [v] It is certified that Rule 209(6)(iii) of GFR, have kept in view at the time of releasing Grant to the State Govt.
- [vi] The accounts of all grantee Institutions or Organisations shall be open to inspection by the sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG(DPC) Act 1971 and internal audit by the Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry or Department, whenever the Institution or Organisation is called upon to do so.
- [vii] It is certified that 'Rule 212(5) is not applicable to this grant.
- [viii] It is certified that all the principles of Rule 215(2) of GFR have been kept in view at the time of releasing Grant to the State Govt.
3. The amount of grant-in-aid is finally adjustable in the books of the Principal Pay and Accounts Officer, Ministry of Women and Child Development, D-Wing, Ground Floor, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi. **The payment of the State Governments would be arranged through CAS, Reserve Bank of India, Nagpur.** The State Accountant Generals will send intimation regarding receipt of grant-in-aid to the Principal Pay & Accounts Office, Ministry of Women and Child Development, D-Wing, Ground Floor, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi.

2. The above-mentioned grant is subject to the under mentioned conditions:-

- [i] The Central Share of grants for the year 2014-15 comes to Rs. 22,41,21,000/- [Rupees Twenty Two Crore Forty One Lakh Twenty One Thousand only] after deducting the unspent balance of 2013-14 and 1st instalment of 2014-15 already released to Government of Gujarat. As per the instruction of Integrated Finance Division, 75% of total eligible grant i.e. Rs. 16,80,91,000/- [Rupees Sixteen Crore Eighty Lakhs Ninety One Thousand only] is being released to Government of Gujarat for the year 2014-15.
- [ii] As approved by PAB recurring grant including staff salary have been provided for 12 months for State Project Support Unit (SPSU) as per revised ICPS norms from April, 2014 to March 2015, however, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released. PAB did not approve the balance non-recurring grant as SPSU would cease to function from 2015-16.
- [iii] As approved by PAB recurring grant including staff salary have been provided for 12 months for State Child Protection Society (SCPS) as per revised ICPS norms from April, 2014 to March 2015, however, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released. PAB also approved the balance non-recurring grant as per revised ICPS norms.
- [iv] As approved by PAB recurring grant for 12 months of 2014-15 for 26 DCPUs including salary of staff as per revised ICPS norms have been provided. PAB also approved the balance non-recurring grant for 26 DCPUs as per revised ICPS norms. For the remaining 7 new DCPUs entire non-recurring and recurring grant for 3 months of 2014-15 w.e.f. January, 2015 was approved including salary of staff. Accordingly, Sponsorship and Foster care fund for all 33 DCPUs was also approved by the PAB for 2014-15, however, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released.

PAB also approved the balance non-recurring grant as per revised ICPS norms.
- [vi] **As approved by PAB** recurring grants for 8 Government run SAAs, has been provided for complete financial year 2014-15. Further, as approved by PAB, recurring grants for 6 NGO run SAA, have been provided for complete financial year 2014-15 as per revised ICPS norms. PAB also approved entire non-recurring grant and recurring grant to 5 additional SAAs for 6 months of 2014-15 w.e.f. October, 2014 as per revised ICPS norms, however, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released. (List attached)

However, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released. (List attached)

- PAB approved recurring grant to 28 NGO run Homes as per revised ICPS norms, for which grant was released during 2013-14, as per actual number of beneficiaries for complete financial year 2014-15. However, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released. (List attached)
- [viii] PAB accorded in-principle approval for entire non-recurring and recurring grants to 10 NGO run Open Shelters, for 3 months of 2014-15 as per revised ICPS norms subject to submission of details of NGOs by the State Government.
- [ix] There are 33 Child Welfare Committees (CWCs). **As approved by PAB**, recurring grant for 26 existing CWCs have been provided for the complete financial year 2014-15 based on the actual number of sittings, including salary of Data Entry Operator, as per revised ICPS norms. For the remaining 7 new CWCs entire non-recurring and recurring grant for 3 months of 2014-15 w.e.f. January, 2015 was approved including salary of staff. The State has informed that the number of CWC sittings is 3 per week. However, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released. The meeting allowance/honorarium of the Chairperson and members of the CWCs has been calculated on the basis of number of sittings as provided by the State Government.
- [x] There are 33 Juvenile Justice Boards (JJBs). **As approved by PAB**, recurring grant for 26 existing JJBs have been provided for the complete financial year 2014-15 based on the actual number of sittings, including salary of Data Entry Operator, as per revised ICPS norms. For the remaining 7 new JJBs entire non-recurring and recurring grant for 3 months of 2014-15 w.e.f. January, 2015 was approved including salary of staff. The State has informed that the number of JJB sittings is 20 per month. However, as per instructions from Integrated Finance Division, MWCD, 75% of total Central Share is being released. The meeting allowance/honorarium of the members of the JJBs has been calculated on the basis of number of sittings as provided by the State Government.
