PAB also approved non-recurring grant for Up-gradation (structural changes) for 3 Homes (2 Observation Homes and 1 Children's Home) as per PWD estimates submitted by the State Government.

- [vii] As approved by PAB, recurring grants for complete year of 2014-15 has been provided for 22 CWCs, except the salary of data entry operators, which has been approved for 8 months w.e.f. August, 2014 as per ICPS norms as per actual number of sittings and as per revised ICPS norms. PAB also approved the balance non-recurring grant as per revised ICPS norms. The State has informed that number of CWC sittings varies from 1 to 2 per week. The calculations have been carried out for each CWC as per the number of meetings indicated against them.
