This is with regards to good implementation practices established under the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS). The Scheme has, since being introduced in February 2009, put the protection of children at the centre of the development agenda and been a catalyst for generating considerable discussion on Child stakeholders, including State Governments/UT Administrations, Civil Society organisations, academicians etc.

In addition, ICPS has been instrumental in creating a space wherein an exchange of learning and information is facilitated, among implementing agencies at various levels.

2. As you know, the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) has been conducting consultations with State Governments/UT Administrations, with periodic frequency, to facilitate such cross learning and strengthen imprementation of the Scheme. In 2012-13 the focus of these consultations was to identify and share some good practices in implementation across the country.

Subsequently, presentations on these practices have also been uploaded on the Ministry's website for further dissemination and replication, regarding which information has been sent to you vide letter, no.14-1/2010-CW-II dated 28th February, 2013.

- 3. To ensure wider discussion and learning as well as recognise exemplary efforts being made to provide efficient child protection services to children, the Ministry is now proposing to undertake documentation of select good practices with participation of all stakeholders. It is expected that the documentation so developed will further facilitate sharing of ideas and knowledge.
- 4. I would therefore request you to identify two (minimum innovations and good practices, in the field of child protection in your State and send us the information related to these in the template enclosed with this letter by 15th June, 2013, at the latest. The information on good practices, once collated will be reviewed through consultation and visits and thereafter those that are relevant and have the potential for replication will be documented for easy access by all States.
